I. SUMMARY

This report summarizes planned humanitarian and development activities of major donors in the Karamoja sub-region. The report presents information from 11 major donors including Austrian Development Agency, Belgian Development Cooperation, Danish Development Cooperation, European Union, Foreign and Commonwealth Development Office (UK), German Development Cooperation, Embassy of Ireland, Italian Cooperation, Netherlands Development Cooperation, Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency (SIDA), and USAID.

Seven donors provided specific information on funding allocations to Karamoja in 2022. The remaining four donors provided funding information for multiple years that covers multiple regions within Uganda.

The seven donors that provided Karamoja specific funding information include Belgian Development Cooperation, Danish Development Cooperation, European Union, German Development Cooperation, Embassy of Ireland, Italian Cooperation (AICS), and USAID. These seven donors allocated over 60 million United States dollars (US\$), or approximately 230 billion Ugandan shillings (UGX). See Table 1.

US government funding represents 62%, followed by the Embassy of Ireland and EU with 14% and 10% contributions respectively. AICS contributes 7% of the total estimated funding. See Figure 1.

Funding information for four donors is available but not specific to Karamoja and not specific to 2022. It is expected that a significant proportion of this funding is being spent in Karamoja in 2022. See Table 2.

Figure 1. Karamoja donors' estimated spending for 2022.



Government budget allocation

The government of Uganda approved budget estimates for fiscal year (FY) 2021/22 for all the nine districts and the two municipalities (Moroto and Kotido) in Karamoja is about UGX 139 billion. For details see Table 3.

2. NUMBER OF PROJECTS




Figure 2. Number of active projects by district in Karamoja, 2022.

A total of 71 projects are funded by the 11 donors. The distribution of the projects across the nine districts is relatively uniform. Moroto gets the highest number of projects with 61 active projects followed by Abim, Amudat, Kaabong, and Kotido with 43 projects each. See Figure 2 below.

3. NUMBER OF IMPLEMENTING PARTNERS




Figure 3. Number of implementing partners by district in Karamoja, 2022.

A total of 54 partners are implementing the 71 active projects. Moroto hosts the highest number of implementing partners (IPs) with 45 IPs operating in the district, followed by Abim with 37 IPs. Kaabong and Kotido each host 35 IPs. See Figure 3.

4. NUMBER OF PROJECTS BY DONOR




Figure 4. Number of projects by donor in Karamoja, 2022.

Most of the donors support multiple projects, with USAID funding 16 projects out of the total of 71 projects, followed by Ireland funding 14 and EU funding 9 projects. See Figure 4 below.

5. NUMBER OF SECTORS SUPPORTED BY DONOR PROJECTS




Figure 5. Number of sectors by donor in Karamoja, 2022.

Most of the donors support multiple sectors, with USAID supporting 15 different sectors followed by EU supporting 10 sectors. Embassy of Ireland, Germany, and Belgium each support eight sectors. See Figure 5.

6. NUMBER OF DONOR PROJECTS BY SECTOR




Figure 6. Number of projects by sector in Karamoja, 2022.

Out of the 71 active projects in 2022, 19 projects support crop/livestock agriculture. Similarly, the governance/ accountability, and gender inclusion/women empowerment sectors are each supported by 15 projects followed by the health sector, which is supported by 14 projects. Only a few projects are engaged in the social protection and food sectors. See Figure 6 below.

7. NUMBER OF DONORS SUPPORTING DIFFERENT SECTORS




Figure 7. Number of donors by sector in Karamoja, 2022.

The gender inclusion and women empowerment sector receives funding from seven donors. The agriculture and governance/accountability sectors each receive funding from six donors. The education, health, and conflict/peace building sectors receive funding from five donors each. See Figure 7 below.

8. DONOR PROJECT ALIGNMENT WITH KARAMOJA INTEGRATED DEVELOPMENT PLAN (KIDP) 3 STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES




Figure 8. Donor projects' alignment with KIDP 3 strategic objectives in Karamoja, 2022.

Out of a total of 71 projects, 32 projects align with strategic objective (SO) 3 of the Karamoja Integrated Development Plan (KIDP 3); i.e., enhance development of human capital. Twenty-eight projects align with SO 1: consolidate peace, security, and governance in Karamoja. Seventeen projects align with SO 2: strengthen Karamoja pastoral and agropastoral livelihoods. Sixteen projects align with SO 7, which focuses on environment and natural resource management. Currently active donor-funded projects don't align with SOs 5 and 8. See Figure 8 below.

9. IMPLEMENTING PARTNERS (IPS) BY TYPE




Figure 9. Implementing partners by type in Karamoja, 2022.

The 11 donors support humanitarian and development interventions in Karamoja through 55 IPs. Most of the projects are directly implemented by international non-governmental organizations (INGOs), representing 50% of the projects. Direct implementation through government, both local and national, represents approximately 20% of the overall total. National NGOs (NNGOs) and community service organization (CSOs) represent 17% of the IPs. United Nations (UN) agencies represent 15%. See Figure 9.

10. NUMBER OF PROJECTS BY END DATES




Figure 10. Projects by end date in Karamoja, 2022.

Over a third (37%) of currently active projects will come to an end in 2022. About 37% of the projects will continue through to 2023 and 2024, and close to a quarter of the currently active projects continue beyond 2025. See Figure 10 below and Tables 4–14 for details.
